




FINANCIALS

Thanks to 334 unique donors in the 2015/2016 fiscal year, Chabad experienced a 38% increase in funds raised from the previous fiscal year.

Chabad on Campus of Queens continues to operate with a modest budget, and we strive to stretch every charitable dollar. This much needed increase of resources will allow the organization to continue growing and expanding.

In addition to ongoing development throughout the year, this past year was host to three specific fundraising initiatives.





We successfully hosted our first online fundraiser in December 2015, "Thirty for Thirty," raising \$34,419.50 in 30 hours (Appendix B).



The impact of the annual raffle has continued to rise. This year, 170 people purchased 713 tickets, for a total of \$25,668 raised.





Our monthly donors are a crucial part of the stability of Chabad, contributing 18% of the annual budget.

SHABBAT IN THE MOUNTAINS











This chart shows the impact of the three anchor donors on the "30 for 30" campaign to raise \$30,000 in 30 hours. Each anchor donor pledged \$5,000, and the campaign goal was to crowd fund an additional \$15,000. Ultimately the campaign generated an additional \$19,419.50.

Winter Kollel – as an outgrowth of our success with high level learning and instruction we envision a winter break collegiate kollel for both men and women. **Students will enrich their knowledge and Jewish experience** with the highest levels of instruction, deep philosophical texts and a broad range of lectures in the spirit of the classical warmth of Chabad. The weeklong program will be located in NYC, open to students from around the country, and function under the auspices of the Chabad on Campus International office.
